

2:4 Talent

The Presbyterian Women fellowship at local, district or presbytery levels disburse certain amount of money as working capital to individual members to make profits in whichever way they can. After a few weeks or months they meet again to see how much profit they can make, so each individual brings their making and submit along with the working capital. This method is called 'talent' and hence, becomes a source of income for the church. Also, a container is distributed to each and every house to slot in money for mission work. They used to open at the end of the year and the highest donor or slotter is given a good prize in token of appreciation and encouragement to continue doing the same good job.

2:5 Faith promise

The Presbyterian Women Fellowship also organise a kind of campaign, challenging members of the congregation as to how much they can promise to contribute for mission work and the ongoing ministry. Having fully convinced, each individual out of their own commitment promised certain amount of money to contribute. Some promise to contribute every month, some quarterly, some half yearly and some, annually. So in this manner members of the congregation have commitment and strive towards achieving their set target or promise. This is called faith promise.

2:6 Multipurpose Project

The CHT Synod PWF raised fund for building by every woman working in government office and agriculturalists by contributing one day wages and put up a big building at Mission compound at Haflong as multipurpose and administrative building.
